YEAR END TAX PLANNING

Just 15 days and 2018 is just a memory. Have you included your church on your Christmas List or year-end planning? If you need an additional tax break, please remember your parish. Several ways to save on your taxes are the following:

APPRECIATED STOCK: Gifts of appreciated stock is a great way to save on your taxes and give to your parish. No paying of capital gains tax when it is transferred directly to the church.

IRA REQUIRED MINIMUM DISTRIBUTION AT 70 1/2: Did you know that you could save money on your taxes by donating your annual required minimum distribution directly to St. Mary's Church or Lourdes Capital Campaign? You can make up to \$100,000.00 or \$200,000.00 if your spouse is also 70 1/2 in donations to a charitable organization. Direct-from-your-IRA donations are called qualified charitable distributions, or QCDs. They are tax-free and no deductions are allowed for them, so QCDs don't directly affect your tax bill. However, they count as withdrawals for purposes of meeting the required minimum distribution (RMD) rules that apply to your traditional IRAs after age 70 1/2.

GIFTS OF GRAIN: Are you looking for a way to minimize your tax liability? There are tax advantages for farmers who make charitable gifts of grain to St. Mary's Church. When an agricultural producer transfers legal ownership of the commodity to a charity before it is sold, the producer will not have taxable income from a sale, thus minimizing taxes. Tax savings may be realized on federal income tax, state income tax and self-employment tax, depending on the producer's specific circumstances.

Check with your tax advisor, or the parish office for more information. Thank you to those that generously give to our parish. Please continue to pray for our parish and our parish family.

CONSIDER USING ONLINE GIVING: By using online giving your church receives a consistent income. No envelopes to open and no money to handle – contributions are deposited directly into the church bank account. No posting of envelopes - contributions are automatically downloaded into the church collection program. See your contribution record at the click of the mouse. **Don't use the computer, but would like to try it?** Call Linda at the parish office and she will be glad to help get it set up for you. Online giving is safe and secure, and you decide exactly when your gift is made and where it goes.
